From the Pastor's Desk

In light of the upcoming presidential election, and the polarization that pervades our society, I was trying to find something which would perhaps give me some relief as well as understanding as to what is happening to our world. Some of these thoughts are taken from others, most notably Thomas Merton and

Archbishop Charles Chaput of Philadelphia.

I think that we don't love each other enough. Or is it, in reality that, we don't love each other at all? We are so convinced of our rightness in all things, that we fail, more times than not, to even notice the other. Instead of taking note of their humanity — as someone created in the image and likeness of God — we see, instead, only positions. And it's much easier to dismiss positions than persons, isn't it?

Each of us was given free will at birth. And most of us have developed a pretty keen sense of what's right and wrong since then. Each day, we are confronted by choices. And we're free to choose, each day, between righteousness and corruption; however the consequences of our daily decisions and dealings means there is a cost. Perhaps, one day, there may be "heck" to pay. Or maybe not.

Our own understanding of God goes bad whenever we claim territory, set boundaries, and then defend mightily the very gateway to our hearts. It's absurd, even blasphemous, to assume that God prefers any political party or politician in any election year. By his very nature, God is concerned with good and evil and the choices that we make. For Catholics, no political or social issue stands in isolation.

God created us with brains, and we are expected to use them well, to think deeply and clearly, rightly ordering the factors that guide us, before we act politically. Yet modern day American life seems designed to do the opposite: it seems bent on turning us into opinionated and distracted cattle unable to gain mastery over our own thoughts and desires.

When this happens, we reject, fully, Christ's invitation, His command to love one another. In the end, we need to understand and live the message that it's not about us against them.

Rather, it's about God with us – Emmanuel.

Let's not willingly, and ever-so-impulsively, surrender our faith to our feelings just because it's so easy to do so.

#### SCOTUS Overturns Texas Law--Endangers Women On June 27th, the Supreme

Court of the United States (SCOTUS) reversed part of a pro-life Texas law that pro-

tected women's health and, in so doing, closed abortion clinics that couldn't meet minimum medical clinic safety and cleanliness standards. These laws were put in place to have abortion clinics meet the same building standards as ambulatory surgical centers and make sure that abortionists have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital for medical emergencies. The ruling by SCOTUS puts similar laws passed in 23 other states in danger. Even pro-abortion advocates realize that this doesn't look good; not adhering to basic cleanliness and basic safety in abortion clinics should be a concern for everyone, as it puts women at great risk.
