Missions. Missionaries. It probably conjures up images of jungles, orphanages, jeeps and a religious person —usually a sister, brother or priest - who stands in front of a congregation at a weekend Mass and asks for money. With stories that tug at our heart strings. Sometimes

they have accents that are not easy to understand, which just adds to the mystique of it all. Missionaries are people who live just a village away from the cannibals; they travel on rafts down the river and baptize pagan babies when we send them five dollars. They grow long beards and wear white cassocks or habits; it is always hot in mission countries, which are always poor. We're not really sure what our connection is to them but we know that there is a connection. What is it really all about?

This Sunday, and every year in October, we observe WORLD MISSION SUNDAY. Oh no. Another collection. Well, yes, that may be the case. However, the missions, specifically the foreign missions, are not about money. Finances definitely are necessary to carry out some of the programs and institutions that are staffed by the missionaries nevertheless it is more than that; much more than that. Missionaries are not social workers, they are Gospel workers. Clinics, schools and boarding homes are not the main place of employment for missionaries; we work in Churches and chapels. Missionaries live and preach the Gospel to those people and in those areas where the Gospel is not yet known. We call this the mission "ad gentes", two Latin words meaning "To the nations". In recent years the Church is calling us to a "new evangelization", a reawakening of the faith, a renewal of living together with Christ and in the Church. Missionary work is one of "Primary Evangelization", the first announcing of the Gospel to people who have not yet heard it. It is an awakening to the grace of God. This is what we commemorate on World Mission Sunday: the mission ad gentes.

### Fr. Ken (continued from front page)

There are some things that missionaries are not. Missionaries are not proselytizers. We don't run around baptizing everyone that we encounter. We don't try to convince people to "join" the Catholic Church by giving them the necessities of life (food, medicine, an education). We also are not "boy scouts or girl scouts". Not all mission work takes place in the jungle or among tribes or clans or in small villages. In fact, nowadays it is more common to hear about the mission in the great megalopolises of the world. As you know from what I wrote a few months ago, I am a homegrown missionary. I was sent to the missions in Japan. Most people would never think of Japan as a country for missionaries. There are no jungles. It is not a third-world country. However, I was not just a pastor in a parish that happened to be in Japan rather than just down the street from you. I was a missionary. Jesus Christ and His Gospel are scarcely known and hardly understood by the vast majority of people in Japan. I lived in the world's largest megalopolis of metropolitan Tokyo, where more than thirty seven million people live side by side. Japan has a history of Christianity of more than 450 years, yet very few people (perhaps about 1% of the population) call themselves Christian. Missionaries are there to "sow the seeds, which others will harvest". Missionaries are there because everyone is a child of God and has the right to know of the Gospel of Christ and the love God has for them.

Pope Francis, in his message for this year's Mission Sunday, calls missionaries "witnesses of mercy". "Each Christian and every community must discern the path that the Lord points out, but all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the 'peripheries' in need of the light of the Gospel"

As our parish continues to grow, I pray that each of us recognizes the need to not only look inward to our own needs and concerns, but especially to look beyond the walls that sometimes confine us.

#### Some financial information

After the selling of the former Divine Savior building and property, and the expenses taken from the purchase, our debt with the Archdiocese of Detroit is now \$2,293,416.98 I have informed the Archdiocese that, beginning in September, we will be repaying the debt a little at a time. We are presently repaying the debt at \$5000 a month; those funds come directly from the sale of the former St. Bernadine property. The buyers of that property are paying us monthly. It is not a large amount, but it does show to the Archdiocese our willingness to try, little by little. Please pray that we can now sell the former St. Damian building. Fr. Ken
