During the Advent and Christmas season, among the many things that kept me busy was visiting of the sick and administering the Sacrament of Anointing of the sick. I have been reflecting upon this, and I thought I might try to explain of few things so

that we all have a better understanding of this sacrament.

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. It is sad for me to experience a situation where a family waits until the last minute, days or even hours before their loved one is passing away, to call a priest. Often times they then scramble around to find a priest, are frustrated because perhaps they cannot find one immediately. There are even times when the Church is "blamed". Preparation for this Sacrament is essential. Days, weeks, even months before a person passes on, the priest should be called. In addition, anytime the health situation of a person, especially an elderly or sick person, changes, they could receive the Sacrament. A person may receive this Sacrament more than once, although it is best to be prudent. Of course, if someone is rushed to the hospital in an emergency, calling the priest is the right thing to do. The sacrament brings comfort to persons in such situations.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. Because of the nature of the Sacrament, young children need not receive it.

There is no promise that a person who receives the Sacrament will automatically go to heaven, just as there is no fear that a person who does not receive the Sacrament will not go to heaven. This Sacrament, just like all of the others, is not magic.

If anyone in the parish wishes to receive the Sacrament, they may call the office to schedule reception of the Sacrament. If they are able to come to church, the best time to schedule is after Mass, either on the weekend or during the week. If the person is not able to come to church, I will arrange a time with them or the family to visit either the home or facility where the person lives.

I am planning to have a communal anointing Mass, hopefully at all Masses on a weekend during the Easter season.

As with all of the Sacraments, through the Sacrament of Anointing, we experience the presence of Jesus with us, and the community who joins together with the anointed in prayer.

Once again our community will be reaching out and helping with the Homeless Breakfast at Newburg United Methodist Church. The last three years have been very successful!

Who: About 50 Guests from the Cass Community

The Inter-Faith Rotating Shelter was started in 1988. The idea grew out of the need for additional beds for homeless persons during the winter months (October through May). Area churches (Baptist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, United Methodist, Roman Catholic, Episcopal, and Independent) came together to feed and house those who couldn't get into permanent shelters. Cass arranges for area churches to "host" homeless people for a week at a time.

Newburg United Methodist Church will be a host church for the week of January 28th - February 4th. Their meal slots are covered, except for breakfast on Wednesday, February 1st, so they really need our help!

Up to 80 people a day are accepted into the program. They shower and go through security at the Scott Building and then are transported to the sponsoring church for dinner and sleeping. The next morning, the Guests have breakfast with the host congregation and are then bussed back to Scott for school, counseling, employment and other activities. 
