Many of you know this already, but in case you haven't heard, I officially "adopted" a puppy last fall. Her name is Chewie, because she looks a lot like Chewbacca from Star Wars. Chewie is a rescue, a mix of Pomeranian, Shih Tzu and Chihuahua. She is now 8 ½ months old and pretty much full grown at 10 lbs. At first look she appears to have black fur, but if you look closely she is more chocolate brown, with

black and a good amount of white in her. I got her from a friend of mine who is in the choir at St. Blasé Church in Sterling Heights, where I helped out for many years. My friend is a vet and she also runs a dog rescue; Chewie, along with her mother and two brothers, were rescued from a "kill shelter" in northern Ohio. She was about 12 weeks old when I got her, and she immediately took to me, and to everyone she met in the parish, from the staff to the children in faith formation to people coming out of Church. She thinks that everyone is here to see her and to play with her. Sometimes she is a little shy, but in general she loves everyone and the attention that is showered upon her.

Since Chewie is still a puppy, she is not 100% potty trained yet. She does well most of the time, but not always. When she comes up to me, whether in the office or in the house, and tells me she has to go "outside", I take her out. This is where the problem begins. She is easily distracted. She sees someone, or a car, or some Canadian geese, or she hears the dogs at the neighbor's house, and her attention immediately goes there, and forgets that she has to do her business. And to try to get her back on track is not easy. I try to take her to her favorite place to do her business, stand to block her view so that she can focus, but usually to no avail. I end up bringing her back inside until she decides, usually within a few minutes, that she has to go out. And the adventure begins again.

Although we are not likes puppies, we too are often distracted. We forget what we are supposed to be doing, or why we are here, and get caught up in getting attention, looking for friends or something else that captures our attention and our interest. And to get ourselves back on track is not always easy.

We are members of the church and attend for one main reason: to serve God, to be with Him, to worship together with the community. It's about God. All of the other activities that we get involved in, everything else that takes our attention is secondary. It has to be that way. We cannot make our membership in an organization, or our participation in something become our primary focus. We are so often distracted by other things – people, decorations, the way things are being done, etc. etc. that we lose focus. Don't let your concerns and personal interests become your main reason for being here.
