Those of you who attended last Sunday's "State of the Parish" gathering have already heard this, but it's worth repeating, and necessary for those who were not present. During Mass, after we sing/say the Lamb of God, the congregation should **KNEEL**. Everyone. In the general Instructions for the Roman Missal (GIRM), which are the official rubrics for actions

during Mass, #43 states: **The faithful kneel after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) unless the Diocesan Bishop determines otherwise.** In our case at St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy, the Archdiocesan Bishop has not determined so. Some churches, like the former Divine Savior church, did not have kneelers. In that case, there is no alternative. If you were to look around during this time, you will see some people standing, most kneeling. I would have thought that, after 9 months, everyone would have followed most of the people in the congregation, but that didn't happen. So, please, from now on, kneel after the Lamb of God. If it's any consolation to those of you who wish to stand, confusion abounds around the country. Nevertheless, the official teaching is that the faithful are to **KNEEL**.

Although the GIRM does not state specifically why the faithful are to kneel, I would presume that it is in respect to the Eucharist. After the fraction rite, where the priest breaks the host into small pieces, he holds up a piece of the fractioned host as he proclaims: "Behold the Lamb Of God...." This is the body of Christ, consecrated at this very Mass. Before Mass began, it was mere bread (host). Although the matter hasn't changed, and it still looks like bread (host), it still tastes like it, it no longer is merely bread. It is indeed the Body of Christ. The Consecration has taken place before our eyes and in our presence. We are privileged to be present for it, and we should not take it too lightly. And so we kneel. The tradition of kneeling at certain times during Mass and while praying began in the Middle Ages. Actually, in ancient Judaism and early Christianity, the form taken for prayer was standing, with hands outstretched. Kneeling is a posture of supplication, and many prayers such as litanies should always be prayed when kneeling.

I have had many inquiries about this and, as I stated last Sunday, didn't think it was a "battle" that I wanted "to fight". However, 9 months later, here I am. May the last few days of Lent fill you with abundant graces.

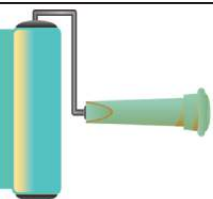
