DECREE

Archbishop Allen Vigneron

On April 5, 2017, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued a decree that will bring about the cessation of Saint Mel Parish territory into Saint Linus, Saint Thomas the Apostle and Saint Mary, Cause of Our Joy Parishes. This means for us that we will have a larger parish territory. The decision takes effect on July 1, 2017. This also means that Saint Mel Church will permanently close on that day. For two weekends, that is until May 7, the aforementioned decree will be placed at the entrance of our parish church. Today we welcome four young children to the Lord's Table for the first time. How many of you remember your First Holy Communion? There were probably many children, in my grade that year there were about 100. Filled with a little bit of excitement and a little bit of nervousness – there was a party afterwards, but I didn't want to make any mistakes in front of "Father" How much did Lunderstand about the day? Not too much Liust knew that it

or "Sister". How much did I understand about the day? Not too much. I just knew that it was special.

Jesus loved children. Remember the passage where people were stopping them from coming to Jesus, since he was tired. Jesus reprimanded them, telling them that no one should EVER stop children from coming to him. "To such as these children belong the kingdom of God." It is unfortunate when I hear people complaining about children "disrupting" Mass. There is nothing so beautiful as the voice of a child. A few weeks ago, a three year old girl was with her family visiting the Vatican. She reached up and took the biretta (small beanie cap) off of the head of Pope Francis. Do you think he was upset? Was his day "disrupted"? Of course not! He laughed, smiled and patted the girl on her head. We have to always be open to children in our church during Mass. Imagine the great effort that these parents go through - getting their children ready in the morning, dressing and feeding them (as well as themselves). God is certainly aware of this and is greatly pleased that these children are there. We should be as well. They are the future of our Church, and they should become accustomed to coming to Mass. They may not be totally aware of what is going on around them, nor may they understand. However they know that they are someplace special. And hopefully, that the people around them welcome them without any judgment or hindrance.

During the ceremony of the Baptism of children, I always ask the congregation "Are you willing to assist the parents/family of this child in raising them to be good Christian children." It's great to hear all of you respond with a resounding "YES". Let's remember that the next time we see children in church. A smile and kind word goes a lot farther than a scowl or an unkind word. Children are a gift from God and we must remember to treat them as such.


