This weekend we are asked to pray in a special way for vocations to the priesthood. More than most people, you at St. Mary's, Cause of Our Joy should realize the need for priests. In many ways, you have not had the best "luck", although I hesitate to use the word "luck". Nevertheless, it hasn't been easy for you. As I think I mentioned in a something I wrote a few months

back, we can't just go to the "priest" store and order a couple of them. It takes a call from God, and the willingness on the part of the young man to listen to God's call and answer.

The first thing we all can do is to pray. There are many things that we should be praying for often: the respect of all life, peace and an end to war and an increase for Vocations. These are three things that come to mind. Praying, though, is not enough. We must encourage. There must be some young men in your families and your neighborhoods. Without being pushy, a healthy suggestion to one of them might be in order. Many times, young men tell me that no one has ever mentioned it to them. You could be that person.

DECREE

Archbishop Allen Vigneron

On April 5, 2017, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued a decree that will bring about the cessation of Saint Mel Parish territory into Saint Linus, Saint Thomas the Apostle and Saint Mary, Cause of Our Joy Parishes. This means for us that we will have a larger parish territory. The decision takes effect on July 1, 2017. This also means that Saint Mel Church will permanently close on that day. For two weekends, that is until May 7, the aforementioned decree will be placed at the entrance of our parish church.
