

May you find this Anniversary a day of rich reward for your selfless dedication of Service to our Lord.



Thank you all for the prayers and wishes for my birthday. One of the secretaries at the parish where I was in Japan would always remind me that, on my birthday, I should remember to thank my mother for carrying and giving birth to me. And I would do so. It would always make my mother feel good, knowing that I was remembering her and I would tell her that it was as much "her day" as it was mine.

Last weekend's celebrations of Pentecost left me feeling very good about our parish. I am convinced that the Spirit has been working extra hard to lead and guide us, to push us and light that fire within each of us, to be renewed and refreshed. Today and in the future, we must remember that in our dealings with one another and in making decisions within the parish, both big and small, that we cannot let our personal preferences drive the decision making. From the décor to the music to the style of worship to the externals, our personal preferences cannot make the rules. In the community as a whole, and even in the individual groups, commissions and committees, we can't just do things "because people like it" that way.

Another concern to keep in mind is the mission of the parish, living the Gospel of Christ. Many times, emotion trumps our mission. Discussion about what is going on, or what may happen in the future, becomes very emotional. I looked back at some of the comments made during the tri-parish Town Hall meeting, the comments left in the "drop box" and other notes and letters from that time; so much emotion-filled words. The unappeasable may never be made appeased. Through all of the emotion, one thing is lost: the mission to reach people. Not just ourselves.

If we are not willing to sacrifice, especially for the sake of others, but instead expect others to sacrifice for us, we block the Spirit. Which is more important? To make you happy, or to make others feel welcome? Sacrifice is not just something that we should speak about during Lent. Sacrificing for others is a pathway to joy. If our focus is outward, to others and not just to ourselves, then we will realize that when we give – of our time, our talent, and our treasure – others will feel welcome. Those who look inward can't understand that.

We should be excited about the future. I wonder how our parish will be in another year. In three years. Even in twenty years. Although some of us may not be here in twenty years, we should still be concerned and excited about it. We can never be happy with things "just the way they are". If that is the case, innovation and new ideas never come to surface, or if they do, they are immediately shut down. We can't say "no" to the Spirit, can we? Let's imagine how things COULD be, with the Spirit leading and guiding, pushing us and lighting those fires.

Feast of St. Anthony Blessing of Bread

During our Noon Mass on Wednesday, June 14th

The popular **St. Anthony of Padua** is known as the patron saint of lost things and as the patron of the poor. Centuries ago, alms given for his intention were used to bake bread that was distributed to the poor. This bread became known as "*St. Anthony's Bread*" and the custom developed of blessing bread on his feast day which is June 13th.

The customary blessing of bread will take place during our Noon Mass. Thanks to the generosity of **Olimpia DeToma**, small loaves of homemade baked bread will be available in church for this blessing. After Mass, everyone present will be invited to take home one of the loaves of bread. In keeping with the tradition of assisting the poor on St. Anthony's Day, a donation for the bread is appreciated and will help feed the less fortunate in our community.

What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a Catholic program or education intended to instruct in the Catholic Faith those who are seeking to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. RCIA is your compass to the Catholic Faith.

Who should look into RCIA?

- Anyone not yet baptized.
- Anyone baptized but not as a Catholic.
- Anyone baptized as a Catholic who did not yet receive First Communion or Confirmation.
- Fully initiated Catholics seeking fuller catechetical knowledge of their Catholic Faith.
- Anyone at all looking to learn more about Christianity.

The RCIA program is led by a team who will help guide participants on their Faith Journey. In addition, participants will also have a sponsor to pray with them and guide them throughout the process. The process consists of four phases:

INOUIRY

Initially, participants will learn the RCIA process and overview of the faith to discern whether this is the step they wish to take at this point in their lives.

CATECHUMENATE

Participants attend a number of classes to learn the fundamentals of the Roman Catholic Church to develop a prayer life and foster conversion.

ENLIGHTENMENT

Participants focus on self-examination, repentance and prayer in preparation for their entry into the Church.

MYSTAGOGIA

Following the rite of initiation at the Easter Vigil, the participants are asked to define the next steps of their journey in faith. The new Catholics are encouraged to get involved in the Parish Ministries and to worship with the community they choose to join on the weekends.
