In the past, I have written about pro-life activities and attitudes. The chaos that is taking place in Charlottesville, Virginia in these days is another example of an attitude that has no respect for life, and no place in our society. The protection and respect for life includes all life. Racism is one of the worst forms of sin against life.

Recently we sadly commemorated the 50th anniversary of the civil disturbance in Detroit, which had its root in race relations. 43 people were killed, thousands injured and the city devastated. In the Church, we recently celebrated the feast of two modern-day saints who were martyred in the prison camp in Auschwitz in the 1940's. St. Theresa Benedicta of the Cross, whose birth name was Edith Stein, was a convert from Judaism to Catholicism. She was killed in the gas chambers of Auschwitz in 1942. St. Maximillian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan priest, was sent to the death camp in March, 1941 and killed on August 14 of that year, giving his life in place of another prisoner who was scheduled to be killed. Maximillian was known simply as prisoner #16670. He was placed in a basement cell with nine other men and given nothing to eat or drink. After two weeks, he was the only one still left alive, so he was given a lethal injection that killed him. His body was burned a day later. Man's inhumanity to man!

Pondering these horrific events, I often ask myself "how can humans treat other humans in such an awful way?" Seventy years later, the same attitudes are alive and well, seeing the events in Charlottesville. We must stand up against these events and attitudes. That's what it means to be Pro-Life.

Archbishop Vigneron has called us to pray, that "In our grief, we ask Jesus, Prince of Peace, to bind up the wounds and heal the root of this evil." Fr. James Martin, a Jesuit author, writes: "Every time you shout 'White Power!' you might as well be shouting 'Crucify him!' And any time you lift your hand in a Nazi salute, you might as well be lifting your hand to nail Jesus to the Cross."

If we truly respect life, we cannot stand on the side and allow this horrible sin continue to exist. Let us pray together for the respect of all life.

Over the last few weeks I have gotten a number of questions about Christian Service and its role at St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy. 4. To inspire all Catholics to use their gifts and join in the work.

So who do we need to help? We need people to plan, and people to do the work. We need the young and the old, people from all walks of life. We often focus on a lack of money, but there are many other types of poverty that our neighbors live with. We need people who can comfort the sorrowful, bury the dead, and visit the sick and imprisoned (and yes I did lift those from the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy). So who do we need? Everyone. We thank all of you that have in the past helped, and all of you that are currently doing your part to help your neighbors. But we hope that you will also share your times and talents with our parish when you can.

ST. PAUL OF THE CROSS RETREAT CENTER

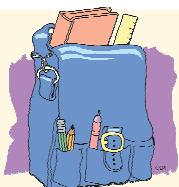

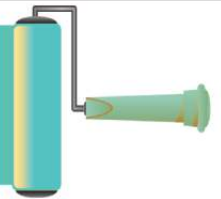
