

Solanus Casey Beatification Mass information

The historic liturgy will take place Nov. 18 at downtown Detroit's Ford Field starting at 4 p.m. Doors will open at 2 p.m.

The Capuchin Franciscan Province of St. Joseph has announced tickets for the beatification Mass for Venerable Fr. Solanus Casey will be made available to the general public starting at <u>9 am on Monday</u>, Oct. 9.

A limited supply of individual tickets will be available only at www.fordfield.com, and a maximum of four tickets can be requested per transaction, the Capuchins said in a news release Aug. 28. Tickets are free, but must be reserved in advance.

While Ford Field is able to accommodate up to 60,000 people for the beatification Mass, demand for tickets is expected to be high.


