Honoring Deacon Jim Hensel



After the 8am Mass on Sunday, July 16, our chapel was dedicated to Deacon Jim on the occasion of his 90th birthday. We thank Deacon Jim for 41 years of dedicated service to our Faith Community.



This weekend we are "commemorating" the civil disturbance that occurred in Detroit 50 years ago. We have been hearing about it all week on the radio and television, Archbishop Vigneron even wrote a message which you will read in his bulletin. I remember the impact that it had on me, an eleven year old boy. My

parents thought it would be better if my sister and I spent a couple of days with my cousins in Livonia, further away from any violence. Our neighborhood in northwest Detroit was "safe"; the neighborhood of my father's restaurant, Livernois south of Fenkell, had some violence and looting. My father didn't venture down there until Saturday, nearly a week after it began, and then he offered free meals to all police and military personnel; he felt safer with their presence around.

I remember watching television as tanks rolled down the streets of my hometown; many of you probably have the same images etched in your memory. I was old enough to understand, but perhaps not grown-up enough to deeply comprehend it all. Even now I shake my head in hurt and disbelief. Within a few years, my family moved out of the city as did so many other families, in probably what could be called the largest case of "white flight" in our country's history. Fifty years later, it still bothers me. Detroit has never really bounced back. This is my hometown.

I have always loved the city of Detroit. I have been a volunteer for the city for many years, helping out at many events and occasions. I want visitors to know and come to love (or at least like) the city that I know and love so well. I love the grittiness and down-to-earth approach of its residents. It pains me when I hear others talk about the citizens of the city in negative ways. These are children of God, and yes, our brothers and sisters. It upsets me when residents of neighboring cities and towns (aka suburbanites) venture to Detroit, with their windows rolled up and doors locked, fearful of every minute until they can get back on the Jeffries or I-75 and back to where they live. They look with disdain on the residents of Detroit. We can't treat the children of God in such a manner. Our attitude must always be one of acceptance. The civil disturbance in 1967 in a large part had a background in racism. It's sad to say that similar racism is still alive and flourishing today. Listen to how people speak of different races, cultures, societies. Most of us come from ancestors who were immigrants to this country.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week marks 50 years since an early-morning raid on a "blind pig" after-hours bar at 12th Street and Clairmount sparked one of the largest civil disturbances in U.S. history, resulting in 43 deaths, nearly 1,200 injuries and millions of dollars in property damage. Although seeds of unrest were sown long before 1967, and solutions have proven elusive even 50 years on, we have made much progress in building up our community to be respectful of the rights of all its members. We can put our faith in Christ and remember His message to love one another.

As we recall these tragic events, let us lift our city, our region and one another in prayer. It is only by the grace of the Prince of Peace that we will find peace. Let us also pray for those touched by the violence of 1967, especially those who lost their lives and loved ones. Let us ask for the intercession of our patroness, Saint Anne as we mark this anniversary, and pray that the grace of healing, reconciliation and brotherhood take deeper root in every heart across our archdiocese.

Finally, as a visible sign of solidarity and brotherhood, I wish to draw attention to an opportunity to volunteer alongside men, women and youth from all faiths for a six-day Life Remodeled blight removal and beautification project taking place in the neighborhoods hardest hit by the 1967 civil disturbance. Visit www.aod.org/liferemodeled for more information or to register.

As Detroit's pioneer priest Fr. Gabriel Richard said following the great fire of 1805 that devastated the city: "We hope for better things; it will rise from the ashes." As we recollect 1967, as we work toward healing, and as we move forward together in faith to unleash the Gospel in southeast Michigan, there can be no bystanders. As described in my pastoral letter, all of us in the archdiocese are to commit ourselves to building inter-cultural competency and breaking down barriers that still divide us. In reading the signs of the times in southeast Michigan, it is clear that we are a community that is ready for renewal. Let us make our remembering of 1967 a guidepost on that path to spiritual renewal.

As disciples of Christ, let us work together side-by-side to build a better City and region so that when people see our work, they will know us as His followers.

CREMATION AND THE ORDER OF CHRISTIAN FUNERALS

Ideally, if a family chooses cremation, the cremation would take place at some time after the Funeral Mass, so that there can be an opportunity for the Vigil for the Deceased in the presence of the body (during "visitation" or "viewing" at a church or funeral home). This allows for the appropriate reverence for the sacredness of the body at the Funeral Mass: sprinkling with holy water, the placing of the pall, and honoring it with incense. The Rite of Committal then takes place after cremation.

The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, and the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or keeping cremated remains on the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires.
