




PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Last year, I published in the Bulletin some regulations for Ministers of the Eucharist, set forth by the Archdiocese of Detroit. I am going to reprint them again, as a reminder to ALL of us concerning respect for the Body and Blood of Christ. Unfortunately, it continues to happen that some people are carrying the Eucharist around with them for

hours or days as they go shopping, or out to eat, or wherever, before taking them to the believers who will receive the Body of Christ. Some people receive the Eucharist at Mass on Saturday evening, and wait until the next morning to distribute. Unless you have an officially dedicated chapel and tabernacle in your home, and I doubt if anyone does, this is WRONG. This is a lack of respect for the Body of Jesus. We must give the utmost respect for the Eucharist. If you cannot follow these regulations, you will be asked to step down from that position. It is a privilege, not a right, to take the Body of Christ to others.

Here are some regulations from the Archdiocese of Detroit concerning Extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist to the homebound, nursing homes, etc.

Ideally, the ministers to the sick and sent forth from the Sunday liturgy (or weekday liturgy) so that those who are cannot be physically present at the community celebration may be united in the Lord with the community. The ministers should receive the hosts for distribution to the sick in a pyx, at the time that they themselves receive Holy Communion. They should not wait until after Mass to place the hosts in the pyx. Before the ministers receive Communion themselves, they should hold out the open pyx, say how many hosts are needed, and wait until that many are placed in the pyx. Then they should close the pyx and receive Communion themselves.

The ministers should go directly to the homebound. It is not appropriate to go to breakfast, shopping or elsewhere along the way.

The Blessed Sacrament may NOT be kept in one's private possession, either on one's person or in a fixed place, except when in transit to bring Communion to someone.

The extraordinary minister should consume unused hosts. Should there be a large number of hosts remaining, they should be returned promptly to the church and placed in the tabernacle. Care should be taken at the next visit to limit the amount of Eucharist being brought.

After the visit, the pyx should be purified. Place some water in the pyx, drink it then wash and dry the pyx.

Extraordinary ministers who take Holy Communion to individual's homes or to institutions must be registered members of St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy and must have attend the training session provided by the parish. "I've been doing this for many years" is not an excuse for not attending. According to Canon Law, "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are appointed to a particular parish or institution only and may not minister outside or beyond the parameters of their appointment."

The Body of Christ is the most precious gift we have received from God. Let's make sure we treat it that way.

NET Ministries challenges young Catholics to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. Every August, 175 young Catholics aged 18-28 leave behind their jobs, school, family, and friends to devote nine months to serving with the National Evangelization Teams (NET).

Divided into 16 teams, they travel across the U.S. for nine months to share the Gospel with young people and their families. Since 1981, NET teams have led over 32,000 retreats and ministered to more than 1.9 million young Catholics.

Traveling Team #10, which contains five female and five males retreat team leads will be with us. They will be hosted by two gracious families in our parish so they have a place to shower and sleep each night which they are with us. We are grateful to offer this amazing opportunity to our high school teens.

November 16 - 19 - National Catholic Youth Conference in Indianapolis, IN - Ten high school teens will be attending this conference along with 350 teens from the AOD. A total of 23,000 are expected to attend from all over the United States.

BEATIFICATION MASS FOR SOLANUS CASEY CURRENT INFORMATION

Fr. Solanus Casey was a humble Capuchin Friar who was credited with miraculous cures and valued for his wise and compassionate counsel. He spent his life in the service of people. Because of his holiness, Pope John Paul II declared him Venerable in 1995. Pope Francis has announced that Fr. Solanus will be Beatified on November 18, 4 p.m., at Ford Field in Detroit.

For those who have tickets and bus transportation:

- Bus leaves St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy Parish for Ford Field at 1:30pm on November 18. Be at our parish to board the bus not later than 1:15pm.
- Ford Field opens at 2pm; Vigil Mass starts at 4pm.
- Concessions will be restricted; food service ends at 3pm. We recommend that you eat a substantial meal before arriving instead. Pack snacks for the bus.
- Pack patience! Visit: saintaidanlivonia.org/solanus for a list of restricted items that cannot be taken into Ford Field. A list can also be picked up in the office.




