First Amendment to the US Constitution

Now, we march for the Right to Life for the pre-born.

This year, we **March for Life on Friday, January 19th**. RTL – LIFESPAN is sending EIGHT buses filled with young people and their chaperones to Washington, D.C., so they can exercise their "right to peaceably assemble". The cost of the buses is over \$50,000 and the students work hard to cover most of it. 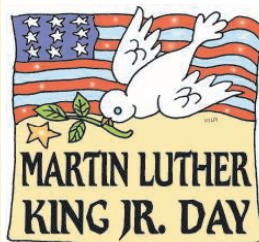

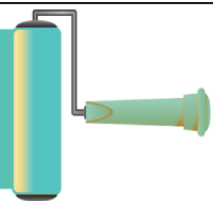

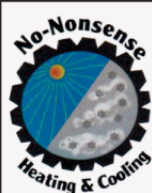
