

From the Pastor's Desk

I usually don't get very upset about things; I've learned to take things in stride. It's not that I don't care, I do. I try to interiorize things and keep myself from outward expressions (except for an occasional roll of the eyes). Last week, however, I was infuriated, and I still am. Watching the news of the 17 innocent people, 14 of them kids, killed senselessly once again in a school shooting. Not only the fact that they were killed, but then how the killings became politicized. Different people blaming various situations. Using religion as a shield. "We need to do this!" "No, we need to do that!" Innocent kids were killed and each of us should be mourning, not blaming. The lack of respect for these lives enrages me. We claim to be pro-life, and yet we are silent. A Jewish Rabbi summed up my thoughts very well.

Our God is a God of all people, of the rich and the poor. God of the teacher and God of the student.

God of the families who wait in horror.

God of the dispatcher who hears the screams of terror from under bloodied desks.

God of the first responders who bravely creep through ravaged hallways.

Our God is a God of the doctors who treat the wounded.

God of the rabbi, imam, minister or priest who seeks words of comfort but comes up empty.

God of the young boy who sees his classmates killed in front of him. God the of the weeping, raging, inconsolable mother who screams at the sight of her child's lifeless body.

God of the shattered communities torn about by senseless violence.

God of the legislators paralyzed by fear, partisanship, money and undue influence.

Our God is the God of the right and God of the left.

God of the liberal and God of the conservative.

God who hears our prayers and seems not to answer.

On this tragic day when we confront this tragic school shooting, I do not feel like praying.

Our prayers have not stopped the bullets.

Our prayers have changed nothing.

Once again, someone has squeezed a trigger and taken out rage, anger, pain and frustration on innocents: pure souls. Students and teachers. Brothers and Sisters. Mothers and Fathers – cut down in an instant.

We are guilty, O God. Guilty of inaction. We are guilty of complacency.

We are guilty of allowing ourselves to be paralyzed by politics.

The blood of our children cries out from the ground.

The blood of police officers cut down in the line of duty flows through our streets.

I do not appeal to you, O God, to change us. We can only do that ourselves.

Our enemies do not come from faraway places.

The monsters we fear live among us.

May our government and the people who have the power to make a change find the courage to seek a pathway to sanity and hope.

May we hold ourselves accountable.

Only then will our prayers be worthy of an answer.


