

From the Pastor's Desk

Beginning with the first Friday of May, (May 4), the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place after the 8:30am Mass. Many people have been asking for the sacrament. Even if there may happen to be a funeral that day, the sacrament will still take place. IF you plan to receive the sacrament that day, it would be fitting that you attend Mass and receive Holy Communion at the 8:30 Mass. Coming into church at the last minute just to be anointed does not put you in the proper disposition for the reception of the sacrament.

If someone is unable to come to Church, please call the church office. I am always ready to visit someone in their home or in the hospital or a care institution to anoint them. It is important that you DO NOT wait until the last minute to contact the Church. Due to circumstances or schedules, I may not be able to get to the ill person in time. This sacrament is NOT a sacrament of the dying; it is the Sacrament of the sick.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the special grace of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as these effects:

- -the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church:
- -the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age;
- -the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of penance;
- -the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;
- -the preparation for passing over to eternal life.

Does a person have to be dying to receive this sacrament? No. The Catechism says, "The anointing of the sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived"

If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced. If you receive the sacrament and are in the same or a similar condition the following month, there is no need to receive the sacrament again. Like all of our sacraments, the sacrament of the sick is NOT magic. Just because you receive does not guarantee eternal life, just as if no is not able to receive the sacrament before they die, does not mean that you will not attain eternal life.
