

CSA Update

In February, we received a letter with our parish CSA target for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Even after receiving a 15% reduction due to the merger of the

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL three parishes two years, our target goal was still very high. \$101,415. This was based upon the offertory of the former three parishes from three years ago.

I wrote to the Archdiocese requesting a review of this, pointing out that not everyone who attended the three former parishes are now attending St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy. The reduction in number is more than the 15% granted.

After a review by the Target Review Committee, an additional reduction of \$12,000 was granted. Thus, our new target goal is now \$89,415. This is great news.

As of July 1, 2018, our CSA income is:

\$71,949.95 pledged. (approximately 84.5%) \$56,051.95 payments collected. (approximately 62.5%)

Thank you so much for your generosity. I am confident we will be able to meet our goal and not have to pay the Archdiocese from our parish savings.

Becoming Catholic: What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a Catholic program or education intended to instruct in the Catholic Faith those who are seeking to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. RCIA is your compass to the Catholic Faith.

Who should look into RCIA?

- Anyone not yet baptized.
- Anyone baptized but not as a Catholic.
- Anyone baptized as a Catholic who did not yet receive First Communion or Confirmation.
- Fully initiated Catholics seeking fuller catechetical knowledge of their Catholic Faith.
- Anyone at all looking to learn more about Christianity.

The RCIA program is led by a team who will help guide participants on their Faith Journey. In addition, participants will also have a sponsor to pray with them and guide them throughout the process.
