From the Pastor's Desk

Beginning this weekend and for the next two weekends, the Archdiocese of Detroit is conducting a campaign to push the pastoral letter of Archbishop Vigneron UNLEASH THE GOSPEL. This campaign is meant to help us in becoming an even stronger, more faith-filled joyful band of missionary disciples. There will be a few things that you will be asked to do; it won't take more than a few minutes. First and foremost, next weekend, November 10 and 11, please bring your PHONES to Mass. Usually I would ask you the opposite, but this is a special occasion. Further instructions will be given to you at Mass.

Each of us can "unleash" the Gospel in different ways. Just as each of Jesus' twelve apostles had different personalities, different ways of following Jesus and, after Pentecost, different ways to preach and live what Jesus taught them, so do each of us. We are individuals even as we form one "band", one community. We can't be expected to do something that goes beyond what our character allows us to. And yet we must go beyond what we "want" to do.

Even though it is only two months old, our community lunch is growing and attracting more people to the parish. Please give the news to those you know who may be in need of a free meal, or in need for some companionship, to come to the meal. In November, it will be combined with the Thanksgiving meal at Newburg Methodist Church on Ann Arbor Trail in Livonia. We will have our next lunch on Thursday, December 27. We can reach out neighbors, community members and those in need; this is one way that we can be missionaries.

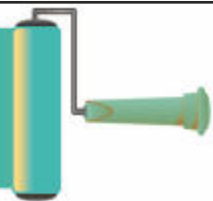
