

From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend we begin the Season of Advent, a season of joyful expectation. It is also one of the busiest seasons of the year. In addition to the preparation for the celebration of Christmas in our homes and families, and all of the activity that entails, the church is full of activities to help prepare our hearts and lives for Jesus. In case you haven't figured it out by now, I believe that the atmosphere and environment that surround us help to put is the proper mood. That's one of the reasons that we decorate our homes at different seasons. Recently Halloween decorations have become very popular in our homes and yards. At other holidays throughout the year we may put out items that remind us of the season; lilies and bunnies at Easter and turkeys in November are two others that come to mind.

The Church also has long had such a tradition. While we await Christmas, we will be surrounded by the colors of Advent; purple vestments and cloths, the Advent wreath, with its purple and pink candles which reminds us weekly of the coming of Christ, the light, into our world.

Please help to prepare yourself for the coming of Christ by participating in the many activities planned during Advent: There are two penance services, one for all the parishioners on Wednesday, Dec. 5 at 7:00 pm and one for children on Monday, Dec. 10 at 6:00 pm. There will be the Mass celebrating the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, Dec. 8 at 10:00 am. She is the patroness of the United States and we pray for her continuing intercession for our country. The next week, on December 12, we will have the Mass celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe at 6:00pm, followed by a Mexican dinner. Last year everyone enjoyed the celebration, led by a mariachi band. On Saturday, December 15, after the 4:30 Mass we will have our annual "Christmas Sing," to help put us a little more into the spirit of Christmas.

Lastly, we have purchased a booklet of Advent prayers and meditations for you. In addition to the usual daily reflection, there are many other prayers including the blessing of your family Advent wreath, Christmas tree and nativity set. The "O Antiphons", celebrated from December 17 through December 23, remind us of the Old Testament prophesies which lead up to the birth of Jesus, the fulfillment of the Old Testament. They are ancient prayers of the Church.

May hope and joy fill your hearts in the most special season.

Anointing of the Sick Friday, December 7

Anounting The celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is intended

for anyone who is seriously impaired by sickness, chronic illness, old age, addictions, or emotional problems and for those who are about to undergo surgery, serious medical testing or be admitted to the hospital. You do not need to receive the sacrament every month, only when your medical condition changes drastically. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick takes place monthly at St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy. It will be Friday, December 7 beginning with the celebration of the 8:30am Mass.

To make arrangements to celebrate the sacrament at other times, please contact our parish office. Patients in hospitals and residents in nursing homes can be anointed if they did not celebrate the sacrament prior to admission. They or their family members should contact the institution's Catholic chaplain to make similar arrangements, or call the parish office.
