

From the Pastor's Desk

As we celebrate this most joyful season of Advent, there are a few saints whose feast days appear during the season. Their lives and models of holiness and humanity can help us to remember that it doesn't take a "super-holy" person to be a saint. We are all called to holiness.

St. Francis Xavier (December 3) was a friend of St. Ignatius, who founded the Jesuits. He became a missionary to Asia, one of the most difficult missions. He preached and lived the Gospel in India, was the first to bring the Gospel to Japan and to Borneo. He was a great missionary. He set sail for China, where he wanted to continue his missionary efforts, but he died before he arrived there. I always think of him when I have something that I plan to do, for God, and plans get changed. God is always in charge.

St. Ambrose (Dec. 7) was born to a wealthy family in what is now northern Italy. He studied in Rome and moved back to the northern Italy and became the Roman governor Emilia and Liguria. He was very well known and when the bishop of Milan died, the people gathered and asked for him to become bishop. He ran to hide, but to no avail. The only problem was – he wasn't baptized. He had come from a Christian family and he knew what the faith was about. So he was quickly baptized, ordained a priest and then bishop. Even today he is much beloved by the people of Milan. There is a festival on his feast day, the "O bei O bei" festival ("O beautiful, O beautiful) which sells Christmas goodies, foods and other treats.

St. Lucy (Dec. 13) vowed from a young age to preserve her virginity to better serve God. Her name was actually "Eutychia". Her family wanted her to marry and she refused. Eventually tradition states that her eyes were gouged out prior to her execution. The word "Lucia" in Italian comes from the world "luce" which means "light". Her feast is in the midst of the season of light, Advent. Her dedication to Christ, despite the torture and pain she endured, can give us a little extra courage and strength in times of pain and suffering.

St. John of the Cross (Dec. 14) was a mystic, so his life was much different than the active lives of the previous saints. I remember in the college seminary we had to read one of his books. At that time (I was 21 years old) I found his writings to be difficult and dark. One of them is called the "Dark Night of the Soul." We know that Mother Teresa, late in her life, confessed that she went through a long period of her life, while ministering to the poor and dying in Calcutta, a dark night of the soul. I'm sure that many people do, at some time in their life, wonder where God is and why God may be allowing things to happen which confuse us.

May your Advent be filled with joy.
