



#### **Anointing of the Sick** Friday, January 4

The celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is intended for anyone who is seriously impaired by sickness, chronic illness, old age, addictions, or emotional problems and for those who are about to undergo surgery, serious medical testing or be admitted to the hospital. You do not need to receive the sacrament every month, only when your medical condition changes drastically. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick takes place monthly at St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy. It will be Friday, January 4 beginning with the celebration of the 8:30am Mass.

To make arrangements to celebrate the sacrament at other times, please contact our parish office. Patients in hospitals and residents in nursing homes can be anointed if they did not celebrate the sacrament prior to admission. They or their family members should contact the institution's Catholic chaplain to make similar arrangements, or call the parish office.
