#### From the Pastor's Desk

This week we are celebrating the Week of Prayer for Christian unity. I remember years ago that this Octave of prayer was very much celebrated and given importance in the church. I have the sense that nowadays, it is not as emphasized as in the past. Perhaps this is a result of our culture and society which emphasizes division and difference rather than looking at what we have in common, whether it be in religion, in politics, and just about anything else as well.

This week of prayer started more than 100 years ago (111 years to be exact) in Graymoor New York, and was eventually accepted by most Christian traditions. The week begins on January 18, which was the original feast of the "Chair of St. Peter" (not so much an actual "chair" as it represents the teaching authority of the Pope) and ends on January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, one the first and greatest Christian missionaries.

Rather than pointing out the differences among the various Christian traditions, it is essential that we look at what we have in common, and at how we can learn from one another. We must overcome the temptation of being so absorbed into ourselves and our own traditions that we are prevented from acknowledging how the Holy Spirit is at work outside of our own familiar surroundings, including in the lives of other Christian communities.

Each year a theme is decided upon which helps to form a basis for the prayers and reflections for this week. This week the theme is taken from the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy; "Justice, only justice, you shall pursue." We are asked to work for what is right and just in our lives and in our society. The Christian, because of Christ's righteousness, is freed for life lived for one another. Life that conforms to the life of Christ. Life that is freed from history of and the need for conquest. Life freed for love, even and especially of enemy. This is the measure of God's justice.

This year, St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy will be hosting the Prayer Service for this week of prayer on Tuesday, January 22 at 7:00 pm. We will pray together with the members of Newburg United Methodist Church, Timothy Lutheran Church, Sts. Constantine and Helen Greek Orthodox Church and St. John Episcopal Church. After the service we will have a time to meet one another in the social hall, enjoying snacks and one another's company.
