From the Pastor's Desk


A few months ago, the Vatican issued a teaching that conclusively revised the Church's teaching on capital punishment. Our Catholic teaching, and the revision to the catechism, now teaches that capital punishment is always wrong. In the past, there were some very limited circumstances that may permit capital punishment. Now there are no exceptions; capital punishment is an "attack on the inviolability (sanctity) of the person".

A few days later, Pope Francis challenged pastors around the world to ensure that this teaching was made public. All Catholics must understand the utmost importance of life, all life. Life is not a political issue that can be a matter of public debate. Just as we respect the life of the infant in the womb and the life of the terminally ill, and all other life, we respect the life of those in jails and prisons, even those who have committed the most heinous of crimes. Respect for life means respect for all life.

There are only two industrialized nations, Japan and the US, that have the death penalty. The other countries that carry it out are considered developing nations. 19 US states, including Michigan, do not permit the death penalty.

Only God knows what is in the hearts of another human being. We cannot be the judge, whether it be in simple situations or in something as grave as the killing of another human being. Just as you know that God understands what is in your heart – even if others do not – in the same way, only God understands others. This must be the attitude we take. A respect of life encompasses all life. It is a teaching of our Catholic faith.
