




From the Pastor's Desk

This week we begin the season of Lent, a time for each of us to look into ourselves and reflect, repent and once more turn towards the Lord. We all have areas of our lives that need improving and we all surely could grow closer to the Lord. Let's not waste this time that the church offers to us.

We begin with Ash Wednesday, Marcy 6. Ash Wednesday is NOT a holy day of obligation, although many people seem to think it is. You may receive your ashes during Mass. We will have two Masses: 12:00 Noon and 7:00 pm. In addition, ashes will be available during the day in the Church. In case you are not available to attend Mass, you may come during the day to the office for ashes. We will have a small altar set up and someone will be here to impose the ashes on your forehead, from 8:00 am until 4:30 pm (except during the 12 Noon) Mass. The church will also be open for personal prayer throughout the day.


