From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Mother's Day! To all of you that have shared your motherly love, care and concern with your children and others, thank you. And to all of our mothers that are enjoying their eternal reward in heaven, thank you!

My mother died 4 ½ years ago. She was a very special woman, at least I thought so. I'm sure my brother and sister feel the same well too. When Mother's Day would come around every year, I would always buy her a plant or some sort of flower. She didn't necessarily want fancy flowers; a plant to hang from the porch during the summer or to plant in the garden was fine with her. She liked plants. Even when I was in Japan, I would call the local florist in my mother's area and order something to be delivered. For Christmas and Easter, too, I would get a poinsettia or a lily for her. In my mind, a mother should receive flowers. That is why that, even though I am not there to celebrate with all of you, I wanted to be sure that all of the mothers and mother-figures in our parish received a flower this weekend. I hope you enjoy it and that it reminds you of the gratitude that we have for you and for all that you do.

We can't forget Mother's Day without being reminded of Mary, patroness of our parish and our spiritual mother. We plan to have a May Crowing after the 12:00 Noon Mass this weekend, to honor Mary in a special way and to remember that we are grateful to her as she watches over and protects us, her children.

By the time you will be reading this, the second week of our PIME General Assembly in Rome should be finished. Half way there! I am writing this a week ahead of time...after the first week. A lot of sitting and listening. A lot! The weather has been cool, cloudy and drizzly – not that we would have too much time to get out, anyway. You all have been in my prayers.


BABY BOTTLE DRIVE

There are many families within our area who are living from paycheck to paycheck. This can be a very stressful time for these families when there is a disruption to their income. During the last month alone our St Vincent de Paul Conference at St.

Mary, Cause of Our Joy has helped five families living in the Westland area with past due rent and utility bills. The first was a resident who had just started working again after being laid off since December. Our assistance helped prevent his eviction. The second was a family that consisted of a mother, her son and the grandmother that needed help paying their utility bill because they had fallen behind after the mother had occurred some unexpected medical expenses. We also helped a mother and her 13 year old daughter with their DTE bill so that they would not face a shut off. The mother had just gotten a new job, but the first paycheck had not come in yet. We also prevented the eviction of a mother and her two daughters. The mother had just picked up a second job to pay the bills, but just needed a little help to get out from under her bills. The last family was a mother and her 10 month old child. Even though she has a good job, she fell behind in her rent because of the time she had to take off while having the baby and trying to cover all of the added expenses related to her new child. Your financial support at Christmas, and with the envelops in the collection basket is what has made it possible to help these members of our community get over some difficult times.
