## NOTES FROM PAUL

In the longer version of this weeks gospel we hear about Jesus calling the first apostles. Simon, called Peter, and his brother Andrew, as well James and John, the sons of Zebedee, stop what they are doing, walk away from their daily lives and follow Jesus. Each time I read this I find it both amazing and a little bit intimidating. I reflect on the things in my life that stop me from doing the same. Some things, like my wife and children, are prudent reason to not 'leave my nets on the shore,' but there are others that are less noble.

One of the things that has long impressed me about this parish are the number of people who generously give of their time, talents, and treasure whenever we give out a call for help. We always have overwhelming support for physical donations (shoes, coats, food) that we have collected over the year. We have dedicated ministers at our Masses, those who help with Faith Formation, and members of our Parish Clubs. We also have those who respond special events like the Kids Against Hunger Event, and the monthly Community Lunch. The response for helping at the Newburg United Methodist Church was so much larger that we will actually be sending people to help with three meals this year. I would like to thank each of you for listening to God's call in you own ways.

## Anointing of the Sick Friday, February 7

The celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is intended for anyone who is seriously impaired by sickness, chronic illness, old age, addictions, or emotional problems and for those who are about to undergo surgery, serious medical testing or be admitted to the hospital. You do not need to receive the sacrament every month, only when your medical condition changes drastically. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick takes place monthly at St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy. **It will be this Friday, February 7 beginning with the celebration of the 8:30am Mass.**

To make arrangements to celebrate the sacrament at other times, please contact our parish office. Patients in hospitals and residents in nursing homes can be anointed if they did not celebrate the sacrament prior to admission. They or their family members should contact the institution's Catholic chaplain to make similar arrangements, or call the parish office.



## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In this Sunday's Gospel, we find that Jesus "... went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people."

### **Feast of St. Blaise (Blessing of throats) All Sunday Masses on February 2**

St. Blaise, Biagio in Italian, Blasco or Blas in Spanish, was a bishop of Sebaste, Armenia, in modern Turkey, who was martyred for witnessing to the faith. He was tortured and beheaded for his beliefs by the local Roman governor around AD 316. This is all that is known about him, the rest being legend. We know much more about devotion to and the popularity of St. Blaise than historical facts.

The special blessing of throats associated with St. Blaise is due to a miracle attributed to him. While in prison, he miraculously saved a boy choking on a fish bone. Early in the sixth century, evidence exists in the Eastern Church that Blaise was prayed to for ailments of the throat. To this day, his feast is a holy day in the Eastern Church. In the ninth century, veneration of St. Blaise came to the Western Church and became very popular. Blessing of the throats with crossed candles began in the 1500s, the height of devotion to St. Blaise, and that blessing is still part of the devotion of the Catholic Church.

No matter what the facts are, St. Blaise is a constant reminder to us of God's care and concern for us in our weakness, sickness, and limited human existence. God's healing touch is with us always. St. Blaise's celebration is one of the ways in which we highlight and thank God for that care and concern.

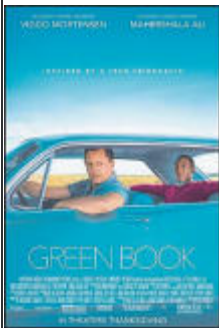

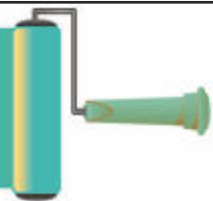
