

NOTES FROM PAUL

In this weekends second reading, St Paul tells Timothy that God "called us to a holy life, not according to our

works, but according to his own design." This lent, while you are giving up chocolate or NetFlix, and trying to remember to order fish instead of a steak on Friday, don't loose sight of the fact that God has called you for something special. Lent isn't really about the burden of giving things up, it is about helping us to find that "thing", that holy life. God cares about you; cares about you so much that he sent his only Son to die on the cross for our salvation. He created you to be with him for eternity. I hope this lent Transfigures you, and helps you grow in relationship with God.

Thank you for the overwhelming support for both the Sister Parish Program, and the Cereal/Peanut Butter Collection so far. It has only been a week, but it has been great to see everyone's generosity.

Coronavirus Preparedness Recommendations

In light of growing concerns about the coronavirus and its effects on those who have contracted the disease, the Archdiocese of Detroit asks each of their parishes to implement the following precautionary measures to help prevent the transmission of any virus:

- For those who attend mass, we are recommending congregations suspend the practice of shaking hands during the Sign of Peace or elsewhere, and of holding hands during the Our Father.
- We recommend emptying (and cleaning) all holy water fonts.
- We recommend our parishes suspend offering parishioners the Cup of the Most Precious Blood during Holy Eucharist, out of an abundance of caution. The Consecrated Host is the full Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, meaning an individual does not need to receive from the Cup in order to achieve full Communion with Christ.


