Many of you know I have three children. My sons are now three and four years old, and if there is anything in this world that they love, it is dinosaurs. They eat, sleep and breath dinosaurs. If we go on family walks, I have witnessed them stopping strangers on the street to preach the 'Gospel of Dinosaurs.' As passionate as they are for dinosaurs, I don't think they have converted anyone to dinosaurs. It doesn't matter how cute they are, or how many names they know, they don't have the tact to show people the beauty and truth of dinosaurs. In today's Gospel, when Jesus makes Simon and Andrew "Fishers of Men" I don't think he made them street corner preacher. Jesus made them into men who would build his church. Authentic people who burned with the message of truth, but also lived in a way that people recognized that they were different. Today, when we talk about evangelization, we are talking about the latter idea of people who share their faith in how they live, and how they talk. Not street corner preachers yelling at people walking by. Take some time this week to pray about how you can become more like these first "Fishers of Men." 


