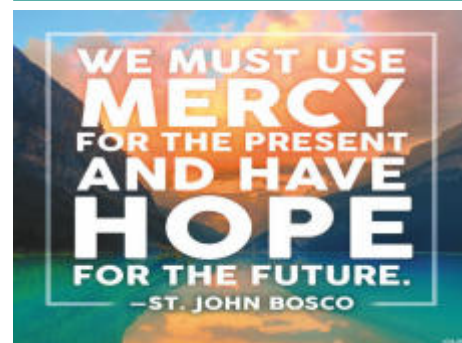

Greetings and Salutations,

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus taught in a synagogue on the Sabbath day and expelled (removed) an unclean spirit from a man. A synagogue is the Jewish place of worship, instruction and prayer. The Sabbath is the Jewish holy day of the week. The people in the synagogue were amazed Jesus taught with authority or "with power." "Unclean spirit" can be defined as bad feelings such as anger, jealousy, the feelings that disconnect us with God. Make a list of all the ways you may be disconnected with God; if you are mad at someone, if you hurt someone, when you forget to pray, and so on. How might we keep our heart and mind ready and accepting of God's love and presence?

In the coming weeks we will begin our journey through Lent. I will be hosting a Lenten ZOOM book study on Thursday mornings. It will begin the week after Ash Wednesday, on Thursday mornings from 10:30am-11:30am. Dates are February 24th thru March 31st. ## NOTES FROM PAUL

"Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties." While this is the opening line from today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, this "regular" Paul wishes the same to each of you reading this bulletin. As this crazy world moves towards another Lent, I hope each of you can find a way to let a little of your anxieties go and grow in your trust in the Lord. I wish I could tell you the sure fire way to do this, but I am sure it is different for each of us, and it is something that I am working through myself. As many of us are thinking of what we would like to "give up" for Lent, maybe there are things that we can do that will help us move closer to God, and farther from anxiety. If watching (or listening) to the news makes you upset, maybe try tuning in to it for a shorter time each day, and reading the bible at that time instead. If there is a certain friend or family member, who has a way of making you anxious, maybe try praying a rosary for them instead of stewing over what they say after you talk. I am not advocating that you don't pay your mortgage or rent for 40 days because they stress you out. I am just challenging you to look for some anxiety that you can give up, trust God will handle it, and make more time for God at the same time. If you can find something, you will probably have a better lent than if you give up chocolate or coffee for another year.

Our High School Teens had a discussion on Loving and Living with the Differences in Others and I wanted to share some of our discussion points on this topic. With all the challenges going on in the world today I think it is a good reminder for all of us. Have you heard the old saying " Don't Judge a Book by its Cover"? Which means simply that you shouldn't make assumptions about someone by just their looks. I think many of us have done that before at least once in our lifetime. As a society, we often undervalue those who are viewed as broken or damaged goods. Throughout salvation history God has used the efforts and talents of these dejected people to advance the Kingdom. One of the many examples of this is the Story of the Good Samaritan or Zacchaeus but there are many others. Sometimes we are so busy labeling ourselves and others that we forget or fail to see what matters—that we are all beloved, children of God. We get so caught up in judging others that we are unable to see them as God sees them. Every person has value and worth and in God's eyes that worth isn't about what we look like or what we can or cannot do. Our worth as God sees us is in the fact that we are God's precious creations, and he longs to have us turn from sin, return to him, and accept His love and the gift of Jesus' sacrifice. He longs for us to then share that great love with the rest of his beloved children. Pope Francis: "If we do not take care of one another, starting with the least, with those who are most impacted, including creation, we cannot heal the world."

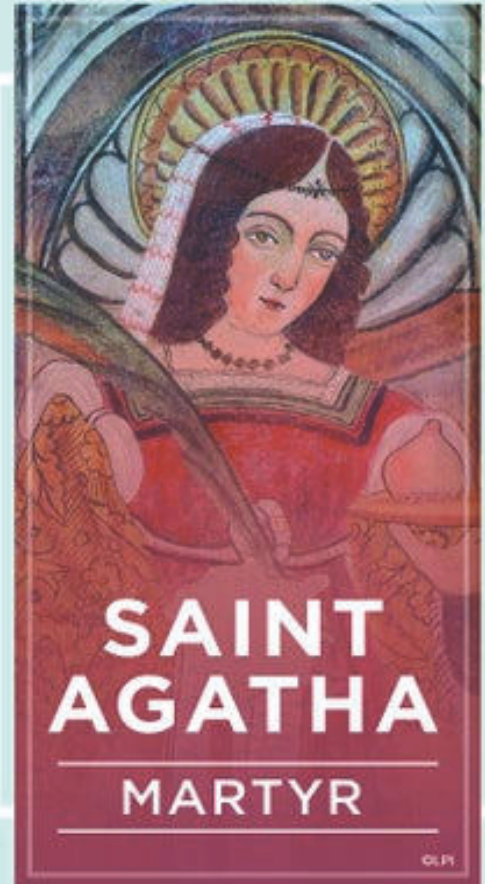

Moses taught the Israelites that God would send prophets to assist them in knowing His will. Why do you think people so often reject the prophetic message?

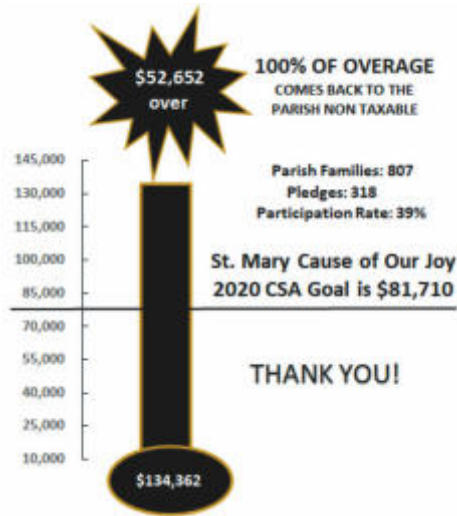
### SECOND READING

This is usually the time when we start to take a good, hard look in the mirror to assess what we have done — or have not done — with the first month of this brand-new year. 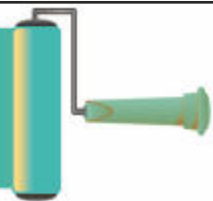
