



A few words on RCIA...if you are someone you know need to make up sacraments, refresh your faith, or would like to become Catholic this information is for you.

RCIA - the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is the process by which people become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The process is concerned with the total formation of the person into: believing with the church community, living with the church community, praying and serving with the church community. The RCIA is intended to serve the unbaptized who would like to learn more about the Catholic Faith. Those baptized in another religion who think they might like to become Catholic. Those baptized Catholics who have not completed the Initiation Sacraments; First Communion, and Confirmation.

The RCIA process is much more than a program. It is a learning and loving process in which conversion of the heart brings one to Christ in a powerful manner. It is an answer to the Gospel invitation. "Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you. Take my yoke upon your shoulders and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart. Your soul will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden light."

NOTES FROM PAUL

It surprises me how fast things accelerate in today's Gospel (Lk 4:21-30). We go from, people who "spoke highly of [Jesus] and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth" to the point a few lines later the same people drive him out of town and to the edge of a cliff where they plan "to hurl him down headlong." I think when most of us hear "evangelization" this is the situation that comes to our mind. You imagine you are talking to someone and having a good time, then you open your mouth to tell them about God... the next minute they are angry and throwing you off the cliff. I can't promise that will never happen, but it is rather unlikely.

First off, it is probably a bad idea to insult the people you are talking too (this is not a "What Would Jesus Do" situation). Second, the modern idea of evangelization has more to do with sharing a little bit of information at a time with someone you know over a long time, instead of trying to change a stranger's life in one meeting. Maybe try to share the message of today's second reading (1 Cor 12:31—13:13), who can be offended by the idea of true, Christian love?



Saint of the Week

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
