



Queen's Quotes from Religious Formation

Greetings and Salutations,

Last Thursday, we celebrated one of our favorite saints, Saint Patrick! Saint Patrick the Apostle of Ireland, was actually born in Britain. When Patrick was 16 years old, he was captured by Irish pirates who brought him to Ireland. He was sold into slavery where his job was tending sheep. Patrick viewed his enslavement as God's test of his faith. During his 6 years of captivity he became devoted to Christianity through constant prayer. Around 408 Patrick fled his master and escaped reuniting with his family. In Auxerre, France, Patrick entered the Priesthood and persuaded many people to become Christians. Years later he was ordained a bishop and sent to Ireland to spread the Gospel.

The original color associated with St. Patrick's Day was actually blue. Back in the 7th century, St. Patrick's day was a religious holiday celebrated only in Ireland. Early depictions of St. Patrick show him wearing blue, and the official color of the Order of St. Patrick, part of Ireland's chivalry was a sky blue known as "St. Patrick's Blue." So how did the feast day of the patron saint of Ireland become associated with green? In 1798 during the Irish rebellion the use of green began when the clover became a symbol of nationalism and the "wearing of the green" on lapels became regular practice. The green soon spread to uniforms as well. That evolution, combined with the idea of Ireland's lush green fields (The Emerald Isle), and Saint Patrick's legendary affinity for shamrocks eventually made blue a thing of the past.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

The St. Mary, Cause of Our Joy Conference of the St. Vincent DePaul Society would like to thank the parishioners for their continuing support. Parishioner donations have helped the conference meet the needs of Neighbors in Need. Most of those funds paid rent to stop evictions and utility bills to stop shutoffs. Other monies paid for food and auto repairs. During the past reporting year, ending November 30, the conference helped 78 people with rent and utilities, and distributed over \$2600 in gift cards for food, furniture, and clothing. The conference considers itself small, but mighty. It is mightier because of parishioners' thoughtfulness and generosity.

In other SVdP news, the conference would like to remind parishioners that donations to the clothing bins must be clothing in plastic bags. Anything else may result in St. Mary's losing the bins. The conference sincerely appreciates parishioners' cooperation with this.

Some have asked about the past practice of St. Vincent de Paul trucks picking up household donations at individual homes. That practice was suspended during the pandemic, and the main council in Detroit is unable to resume that service due to the expense. They have contracted with a private company and there is a substantial charge for home pickup, and also some restrictions on what they will pick up at individual homes. If a parishioner is interested in a home pick-up, please call the office and leave a message on the SVdP extension (219) and someone will get back to you to share the pickup information. May God continue to bless you for your generosity to our Neighbors in Need.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

God clearly reveals his identity as "I am who am." God, who is really beyond all names, is the One who simply "is" as the ground of all being. This ever-existing, uncreated, and all-encompassing presence of unconditional God, who is Love, is very patient as he waits for us to grow and change. God is so near to us that it is easy to miss his presence. As true love requires, God seeks a devoted, intimate, free, and exclusive relationship with each of us. As we walk through the parched, desert experiences of our lives it is easily in our thirst for water and a respite from the heat that we reach for and construct idols that will bring us immediate relief and satisfaction. These false gods, made out of our comforts and earthly desires can quickly take the place of the One who really has first dibs on our hearts. Humans have often wandered far away from God as St. Paul reminds us. In helping each other cultivate and fertilize the ground upon which we walk, God gives us yet another chance to bear fruit and return.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

When St. Oscar Romero was appointed Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977, his country was in chaos. Many people in El Salvador were living in poverty, while a smaller elite group controlled all political and economic power. In 1980, El Salvador broke out in a 12-year civil war that left over 75,000 people dead. St. Oscar Romero set up pastoral programs to assist the victims of oppression. He also became an outspoken advocate for human rights, appealing to the Salvadoran military to stop killing their own citizens.

On March 24, 1980, St. Oscar Romero was murdered while celebrating Mass in El Salvador. A car pulled up outside, and a gunman fired a single shot straight into St. Oscar Romero's heart.

Calling him a "a martyr for the faith" nearly 40 years later, Pope Francis canonized him in 2018. For the occasion, Pope Francis chose to wear the same blood-stained belt that Romero was wearing at the altar when he died.


