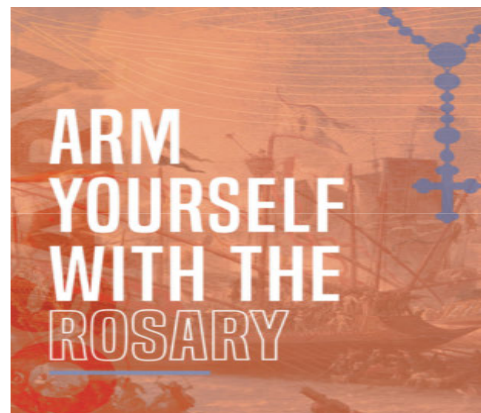

NOTES FROM PAUL

In this weekend's reading we get two stories of lepers; Naaman who is healed by Elisha and the unnamed leper healed by Jesus. The interesting thing is that neither of these men were Jewish, but they both returned to praise the God of Israel once their lives were restored, and their leprosy healed.

The Catholic church offers the sacrament of penance so that Jesus, through the person of a priest, can also restore your life, and heal your soul. Most of us don't seek this sacrament as often as we should, and most of us don't follow the example of Naaman or the unnamed leper who stopped their lives to praise God for this healing act. Like the other nine lepers, we just continue on with what the letter of the law says we should do without acknowledging the miracle that happened. Maybe it is not as obvious because our flesh doesn't become like the "flesh of a little child" once we walk out of the confessional, but we are healed just the same. Go to confession if it has been awhile, and afterwards, thank the God of Our Fathers for the miracle and gift that it is.

MUSIC MINISTRY

As our musical celebration on **October 27th at 7pm** draws closer I want to explore some of the music that you and I will praise the Lord with. Last week we discussed "the spiritual". Today we will look at "gospel" music.

Rooted in American blues, gospel music grew out of the south as African American churches began to congregate. They had humble means and could not afford hymnals nor did they have the training to read music. Combining liturgical messages with their own musical forms, the spiritual and blues, they created a new musical tradition. They started using more upbeat tempos and vigorous performance styles to express their joy in the Lord. Using call and response and ad lib harmonies to draw everyone into participation. Gospel music has continued to evolve even to this day, changing to suit the needs of those who adhere to it. The style has become so iconic many Catholic composers have composed works to mimic the feel of gospel music, think of "Healing River", "Lead Me, Guide Me", "Shall we Gather at the River".

At our celebration will explore some of these, as well as gospel pieces from outside our Catholic tradition. We will even do some gospel style arrangements of old classics, like "How Great though Art" and "Amazing Grace". We can't wait to share this music with you. Make sure you invite your family and friends! Let's fill our Church.
