Our music will be a near continuous expression, one chant, canon, litany or responsorial flowing into another as seamlessly as I can manage.

This is not a concert however, this is a communal praise service, or what the brothers from the Taize community call a "Common Creation". In their Letter to All Communities they addressed "parishes and congregations" as the 'base' of the church, calling them to leave behind passivity, discouragement and rivalries and enter into a "Common Creation". And this is what we intend to do on Thursday night.

I will provide all the texts for our musical selections on the screens, however, they will be repeated enough and simple enough you will readily be able to join in. These pieces include some familiar, "Jesus Remember Me", "Ubi Caritas" and "Veni Sancte Spiritus" and many works you likely haven't heard at Mass before. There is a healthy mix of Latin and English in the Taize lyrics, so I think everyone will find it approachable. The Latin can be a vessel for prayer as our minds aren't focused on the meaning of words but who we are in the eyes of God. I am looking forward to singing with you!

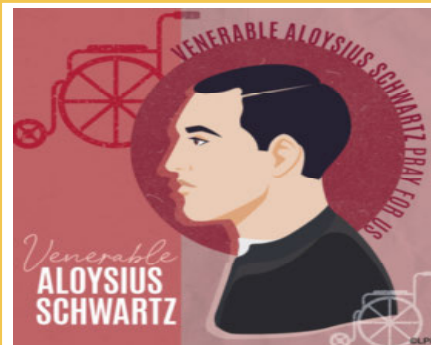

Born Aloysius Philip Schwartz on September 18, 1930, during the great depression, in Washington D.C., “Father Al” decided at an early age that he wanted to be a missionary priest among the poor. After his ordination as a diocesan priest in Washington D.C. in 1957, he petitioned to be sent to South Korea during the Korean War and was formally accepted by the Diocese of Pusan, South Korea. He spent the rest of his life embracing a life of poverty and changing the course of Korean history for those most in need.

Once in South Korea, Father Al was immediately faced with the stark reality of extreme poverty among children there orphaned because of the war. He decided to begin a charity program to provide some relief in his new community. After returning to the USA for a few years due to illness and spending that time raising funds and support for his mission in Korea, he returned to pastor St. Joseph Parish while also establishing the Sisters of Mary Religious Congregation and, years later, the Brothers of Christ to aid in his work. Of this work, Fr. Al said,

Together with the Sisters and Brothers of his orders, he went on to establish Boys-towns and Girls-towns to serve the orphans and street children of South Korea. He also built hospitals and hostiles for many different demographics of Koreans in need.

In 1985 he expanded his charities and founded the Sisters of Mary, Manila in the Philippines and in 1989 they also expanded to Mexico. He was named a Monsignor in 1990, won the Ramon Magsaysay Award — often referred to as the Nobel Prize of the Pacific — and was also nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for his foundation of orphanages around the world. Soon after, his health deteriorated due to ALS and he died in 1992. Pope Francis named Father Al Venerable on January 22, 2015.

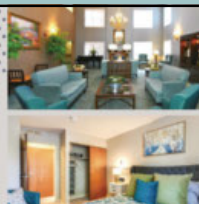
