#### Notes from Fr. Sean Bonner....

#### In Today's Gospel

We are halfway through Lent. During this season of penance, we are called to be converted to the Gospel. In today's Gospel, we are told that God does not condemn us for our sins; rather, we condemn ourselves. Jesus came into the world to bring salvation. Let us reject the darkness of sin and embrace the light of Christ.

#### **Confession and Contrition**

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) refers to three things necessary for good confession: confession, contrition, and satisfaction. (1450) Confession means telling the priest your sins, especially all serious sins.


Satisfaction seeks to "repair the harm" caused by sin. (CCC 1459) It may be something as simple as a few prayers, or it may mean returning something that was stolen. Satisfaction seeks to restore our relationship with God and our neighbors.

Perhaps the most difficult part of confession is contrition. Contrition is far more than the prayer said at the end of confession. The CCC defines it as "Sorrow of the soul and hatred for the sin committed, together with a resolution not to sin again. Contrition is the most important act of the penitent and is necessary for the reception of the Sacrament of Penance." (Glossary)

The Act of Contrition that we recite should reflect the sorrow we have in our hearts for our sins and a commitment to overcome sin in our lives. There are many versions of the Act of Contrition that you can recite when making your confession, or you can make up your own.

I like to recite the Act of Contrition I learned as a child. I reflect on its words, which reflect my sorrow, not only out of fear of punishment but because I have offended the loving God I should love with all my heart. The prayer then goes on to express my commitment to avoid sin in the future.

While I know I will sin again, I am expressing my desire to overcome sin. This desire is the contrition necessary for a good confession. As you prepare for confession during this season of penance, reflect on your sins, bring them to God, and seek his grace to sin no more.



#### NOTES FROM PAUL

I wonder how many people watching sporting events see that guy holding the "John 3:16" sign and actually take the time to look up that passage? Today, this verse from John is part of our Gospel, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Jesus, who is speaking about himself, tells us that we must believe in the Son of God if we want to be saved. I want to be saved. I want YOU to be saved. So, please take some time to think about what it means to believe in the Son of God. Take the time to think what it means to have God agree to be born of a woman, grow as a man, suffer and die on the cross, only to be resurrected again on Easter day. Why did he do all of this? So we "might have eternal life."

God loves us, each one of us, so much that he goes out of his way to save us. That is worth a few minutes of your time to think about. Now thinking about it is just the first step. God went out of his way to offer us salvation, we have to do our part too. Back on Ash Wednesday, if you got your ashes, you heard us say "Repent and believe in the Gospel." We have to turn our back on sin, and move closer to God. I know this is not easy, I have to struggle with it myself, but I hope that we are all together again in the "eternal life" and we will see that struggle was worth while.
