#### Notes from Fr. Sean Bonner....

#### In Today's Gospel

After his resurrection, Jesus spent 40 days on earth with his disciples. At the end of that time, he ascended into heaven to be seated at the right hand of the Father. In today's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, and he tells us to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mk:16:15)

Jesus has prepared us for this work of mission. He has given Himself to us in the Eucharist to strengthen us, and he has sent His Spirit to inspire and lead us. Let us receive all that God has given us, and through our words and our actions, let us proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

#### **Catholic Services Appeal**
