

You plant the "seeds," but somehow they grow into "fruit" later in life (or weeds but that is another parable). No matter your age, don't be afraid to let the Word of God plant seeds in your heart and soul. Let the fruit of the Spirit blossom in your life.

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus simply because the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during it. This feast dates back to 1673 when Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque began having visions about the Sacred Heart, one of which where Jesus told her to promote a feast day that honored his Sacred Heart.

This week I would like to share a quick and easy way to remember to pray for others and ourselves.

Five Finger Prayer

- 1 Your thumb is nearest to you. So begin your prayer by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones, as C.S. Lewis once said, is a "sweet duty."
- 2 The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct, and heal. This includes teachers, nurses, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3 The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president and other civil servants, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
- 4 The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray for them too much.
- 5 And lastly comes our little finger the smallest of all. This is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you." Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.


