

Notes from Fr. Sean Bonner....

In Today's Gospel

We continue to hear from Jesus as he gives us the theology of the Eucharist. After he fed the multitude, the people were hungry to have their spirits fed. In today's Gospel, Jesus begins the Bread of Life Discourse. In comparing the miraculous feeding they had just experienced to the miracle of the Mana in the Desert, Jesus tells us to look forward to the "true bread from heaven." He tells us that He is the bread of life and that whoever comes to him will never hunger.

Paying for a Mass

It is customary to pay a stipend, usually \$10, to have a mass said for your intentions. In addition to supporting the good works of the Church, this stipend is meant to be a sacrifice for your intentions. Because we are accepting money for mass, the Church has ruled in place to prevent abuse and to avoid the appearance of abuse.

Traditionally, mass stipends were how priests were paid. To avoid abuse, priests were limited in the number of stipends that they could accept and, therefore, the number of intentions that could be offered at a mass. Today, priests receive a salary in most places, and mass stipends go to the parish.

Normally, only a single intention is allowed for a single mass; however, we can offer two masses a week for multiple intentions. In our parishes, mass intentions are scheduled long before we know who the priest will be, so I limit these masses with multiple intentions to the weekends.

On weekdays, we only accept a single mass stipend, although that stipend may cover multiple intentions from the same person. Priests are also required to offer masses for the People of the Parish. These rules limit the number of available mass intentions, and they are often requested more than a year in advance.

When we receive requests for mass intentions, we do our best to accommodate them, but it is not always possible. Please contact the parish office well in advance to request a mass intention.

The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults is the process by which people become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The process is concerned with the total formation of the person into; believing with the church community, living with the church community, praying and serving with the church community.

The OCIA is intended to serve the unbaptized who would like to learn more about the Catholic Faith. Those baptized in another religion who think they might like to become Catholic. Those baptized Catholics who have not completed the Initiation Sacraments; First Communion, and Confirmation.

The OCIA process is much more than a program. It is a learning and loving process in which conversion of the heart brings one to Christ in a powerful manner. It is an answer to the Gospel invitation. "Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you. Take my yoke upon your shoulders and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart. Your soul will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden light."
